

Western Cape Displaced People Report

Summary of data collected by TAC ALP & Civil Society
18th July 2008

This report provides numerical data on routinely measured variables, which is useful for assessing conditions in the sites and camps. In addition more detailed descriptions of the five camp sites, and overarching issues, provide necessary detail for understanding the conditions under which many internally displaced persons live.

Using quantitative and qualitative data, several categories are analysed to provide detailed information regarding occupancy, quality and distribution of food, sufficiency of shelter, access to information, adequacy of sanitation facilities, and other issues necessary for providing in depth information about quality of life.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

While the numbers at the camps and sites have decreased over time, conditions have not improved. The information highlights gaps in the current response to the displaced people crisis for Government to address to ensure international norms and standards are upheld:

1. There is an urgent need to address the food needs of children. Many sites do not have milk supplements provided.
2. Over half people displaced consider the current food insufficient. There is a need to review the nutritional content of the food given that displaced people only receive bread and juice in the morning and the same evening meal everyday. This review should take into account the cold winter temperatures. Providing raw food and cooking equipment would not only restore human dignity but would help facilitate culturally appropriate food to be prepared.
3. There are 208 learners who are currently displaced; a plan is needed to ensure that they can access education. 8 sites with children are currently not accessing education.
4. Many sanitation needs still are not being properly met across all sites:
 - a. In over half the community sites there is a need for separate male and female toilets.
 - b. Lighting at sanitation areas is a particular concern in Youngsfield and Blue Waters, women and children feel unsafe at night.
5. The tents in Silverstroom, Soetwater, and Youngsfield continue to provide insufficient shelter and protection from the winter weather.
6. Across all sites there are currently an insufficient nappies and sanitary towels.
7. There is an urgent need to provide detailed and regular information to people in sites on the actions of Government, current news events and their future options.
8. Some sites currently do not have blankets for everyone and more are needed in the camps to protect people from the cold weather. Some people have reported respiratory irritation as a result of the fibres, which are shedding from some of the blankets.
9. Transport for peoples return from health clinics need to be improved. Recent reports from Silverstroom, Blue Waters and Youngsfield also suggest attention needs to be given to ensuring the regularity of a health post on site.

Western Cape Displaced People Report

INTRODUCTION

At the height of xenophobic attacks in Cape Town in the last week of May 2008 an estimated 20 000 displaced persons were housed in about 100 camps and sites. To monitor the conditions under which people are living and evolve over time, the TAC and ALP designed structured questionnaires to capture data on population, health, services and human rights. In addition, site assessors implementing surveys also provided qualitative information regarding the nature of life for displaced people. These data will be used to inform relief efforts and improve living circumstances in the camps and sites.

DATA COLLECTION

Various organisations including church groups, civil society and other volunteers have been collecting data since shortly after the onset of the xenophobic attacks.

More structured data collection began in the week of 23-29 June after approximately 15 volunteers were trained to complete newly designed forms. This report therefore is based on a collation of pre-existing data and data collected using the new questionnaires between 23 June and 14 July. The latter focus was on approximately 53 camps and sites covered by the TAC/ALP volunteers. A total of 93 sites have been assessed.

Data was entered into an adapted existing web-based database (<http://shade.igiveada.mn>).

The baseline questionnaire assessed 79 sites. If data were missing for a particular variable the denominator (N=x) will be shown in the text. This survey was administered through the period of 23 June to 14 July.

A follow-up baseline survey was instituted at 30 sites/camps on the 9th of July. All data are shown in Tables in the appendix where site by site tabulations of all the variables are detailed should it be required to know which sites for example had children, had particular health problems, did not have a responsible government official designated etc.

OCCUPANCY

On 14 July the occupancy of the 53 currently active sites was as follows (shown in Table 1.1):

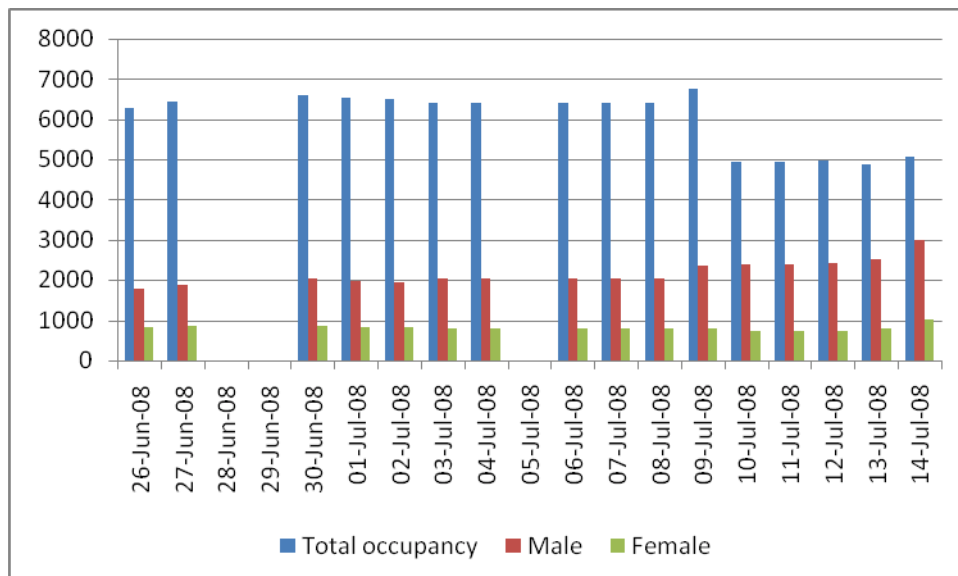


Figure 1 Changes in total population and sex housed at the 53 sites currently evaluated over time

The total number of displaced people appears to be relatively stable between 24 June and 9 July, after which the numbers have declined and subsequently again remained relatively stable. It should be noted the measurement of the number of people is complicated by the following factors: to date differences have existed in assessment methods between the sites, some counting males, females, pregnant women, children under 5 and people on chronic medication all as a subset of the total, whereas others count males and females including children and pregnant women. Furthermore while the numbers are declining at some sites, new sites are being added to the database thus confounding a true reflection of changes in population over time. In some sites the demographic breakdown is unknown, hence the total number of males and females does not add up to the total number of people. For this reason occupancy trends over time for the total number of persons is the most reliable estimate shown in Figure 1.

Overall there were approximately twice as many males compared to females and these numbers are roughly constant over time (14 July there were 1990 men and 1029 women). The appearance that the number of men

and women is increasing is a reflection of better assessment of the demographic profile of this population in the most recent week.

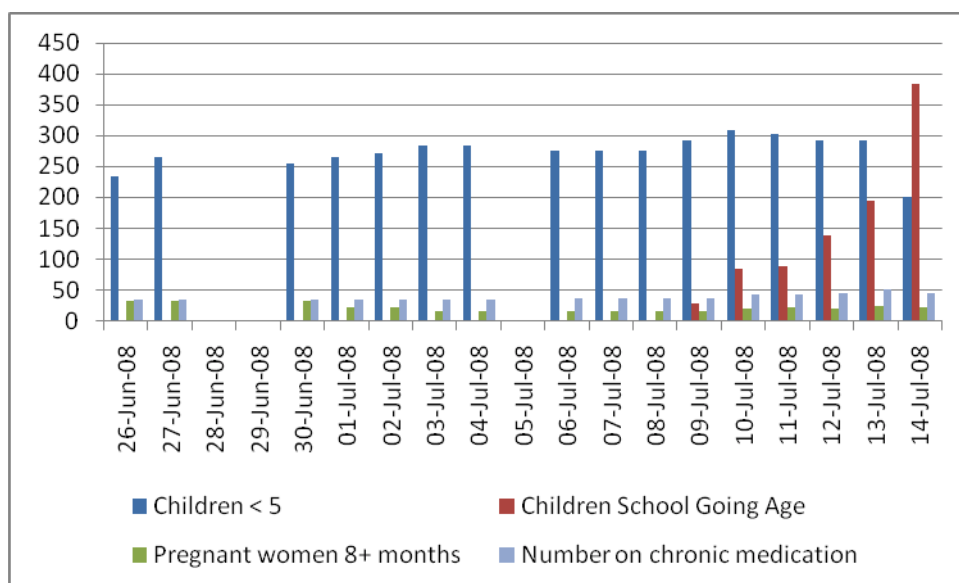


Figure 2 Population of exceptionally vulnerable persons housed in the 53 currently evaluated sites over time

The number of especially vulnerable persons is shown in Figure 2. The number of children aged less than 5 years has declined in the last week. Again, the appearance that the number of children of school going age has increased in the last week is a reflection of this data only being collected in the most recent assessments. The number of women in late stage pregnancy (8 months or more) has remained relatively constant in the last 5 days (around 20 women). The number of people on chronic medication seems unrealistically low as a proportion of the total population ($44/5066 = 0.87\%$ on the 14th of July) and this figure has increased somewhat in recent days as a result of somewhat better assessment. Data on children of school going age has only been collected since 9 July therefore the apparent increase is also a reflection of better assessment.

All the population demographic data were collected over the last month or so, most of the data is recent (from the last 19 days). Most of the data was reported by the site managers; at only 5/53 sites was a headcount performed and at 52/53 sites the population was estimated in the evening (when most people are expected to be present in the camps/sites).

Number of Departures and Arrivals at Most Recent Follow-up (Tables 1.2, 1.2a and 1.2b)

Follow-up data (currently for 49 sites) were collected approximately twice weekly since 24 June. The most recent follow-up data include information on a total population estimate of 4600 people of which 2880 were men and 975 were women. These data were collected to summarise the movement of people into and out of the sites and camps. For the most recent follow-up visits, there were 216 departures and 72 arrivals (most of these occurred in the last week).

The detailed information tabulated in Table 1.2a shows that 143/216 departures left for their original community, 80 went to another community, 1 went to another displaced people site, 6 were repatriated and the details for 14 were unknown, information was not collected on the remaining 17 departures. In church sites, the church community has been playing an active role in assisting people to return to their original community or find new alternative accommodation, often with financial assistance.

The new arrivals, tabulated in Table 1.2b, show that 6/72 came from another displaced people site, 28 came from their original community, and 29 from another community and information was not collected for the remaining 9 arrivals.

All Departures and Arrivals (not only at most recent assessment – these data are not yet tabulated)

Departure and arrival data are collected on an ongoing basis. The questions are worded as follows “since the last assessment, how many people have left the site?” etc, therefore during the entire assessment period there have been 617 departures cumulatively (some sites have been assessed a few times). 220 of the departures were to their original community, 363 to other communities, 2 to another displaced people site, 12 persons were repatriated and 36 departures destinations were unknown.

Similarly, there have been 164 arrivals cumulatively (again, some sites were assessed more than once). 38 arrivals were from their original community, 36 from another community, 60 from another displaced people site, and 18 arrivals were unknown or unspecified.

FOOD

Many of the camps are experiencing the same issues with food. In the morning most people receive dry bread, with an occasional offering of jam or peanut butter. The evening meals will vary across the camp sites, but hardly every vary within a site. Over half consider their diet insufficient. Many meals are believed by displaced people to have been prepared improperly. Every day the diet is the same. As a result, many sites have expressed their desire to have access to kitchen facilities and raw food so that they may prepare their own meals. The ability for people to prepare their own food also a minimum norm to ensure human dignity fulfilled.

There are concerns that the current unvaried diets may not provide displaced people with the appropriate caloric intake for the colder weather. Government should review the various meals served at sites to ensure they meet minimum standards.

Food Distribution Information Derived From Baseline Questionnaire (Table 1.3)

A regular food provider was designated for 48% of sites. Data on ‘who’ the designated food provider was has been collected but the data have not been input into the database as yet (still in progress).

Only one of the sites had no food provided each day (Goodwood Presbyterian Church). Whereas ten sites (13%) had a food provided only once each day, 18 sites (23%) had food provided twice each day, and 19 sites (24%) had food provision 3 times each day.

Food Provision Distribution Information Derived From Follow-up Baseline (Table 1.3b)

The follow-up baseline showed that 53% of sites were deemed, by the people residing there, to have insufficient food and 27% of sites did not have a regular food provider designated. The details of who was providing food are also shown. One site did not have any food provision (Pinelands Methodist Church). 6 sites had food provided once each day, 9 had had food provided twice each day, and 9 sites had had food provided three times each day. Details on milk supplements are also shown; they were deemed to be insufficient at 17 sites.

SANITATION

Though many sites have adequate toilets, their quality is a concern. Many are not regularly cleaned or accessible for children. Some sites do not have separate facilities for men and women. Washing facilities are

also problematic as some are not cleaned properly, and hot water remains very limited. In addition soaps for cleaning and bathing are limited at many sites.

Campsites are also not meeting proper norms and standards for sanitation, especially since many camps do not have proper lighting at night.

Sanitation Information Derived from Baseline Data (Table 1.4)

Detailed data on sanitation was available for 44 sites. There were a total of 363 toilets; however, the number of flush and chemical toilets totalled 404 [262/404 (65%)] of these were flush toilets. Only half the sites (39/79) had separate toilets for men and women. Two sites had no toilets (Holy Trinity Church Gardens, Long Street Artists).

The ratio of people to toilets was largely within recommended norms (1 toilet per 20 people). The following were exceptions: at Africa Family Group Help Mission there were 21 people per toilet, at the Muizenberg Office there were 24 people per toilet, at Pinelands Methodist Church there were 24 people per toilet, at Summer Greens there were 31 people per toilet, at Tennyson Mosque there were 41 people per toilet, at Tableview Liebrant van Niekerk Hall there were 44 people per toilet, and at Blue Waters there were 57 people per toilet. Most recent reports at Soetwater suggest that there are 85 people per toilet.

The ratio of people to washing facilities (showers and baths) was largely within recommended norms (1 cubicle per 50 people). Again, the following were exceptions: at Blue Waters there were 113 people per washing facility, at Tableview Liebrant van Niekerk Hall there were 87 people per washing facility, Soetwater there were 71 people per washing facility and at Zolani Centre there were 74 people per washing facility.

At the Goodwood Presbyterian Church there were 60 people per basin, at Blue Waters there were 65 per basin, at Desmond Tutu Hall there were 87 persons per basin and at Soetwater 94 persons per basin.

At 16/79 (20%) of sites there were disposable nappies available while at 23/79 (29%) of sites there were sanitary towels available.

There is a lack of hot water at 70% of sites (these data are not yet tabulated).

Sanitation Information Derived from Follow-up Baseline (Table 1.4a)

There was data available for 22 sites on sanitation. Soap was not available at 45% of these sites. Separate toilets were not available at 32% of these sites. The ratio of people to toilets was inadequate at four sites (Muizenberg Office, Pinelands Methodist Church, Tableview Liebrant van Niekerk Hall and Tennyson Mosque). The toilets had not been cleaned in the last 24 hours at 23% of sites. The ratio of people to washing facilities was inadequate at Tableview Liebrant van Niekerk Hall. At 45% of sites there were not separate washing facilities for men and women. All sites had a tap as water source.

SHELTER

The present weather conditions have resulted in increased problems due to flooding, wind damage, and the cold. Some tents at the campsites have been unable to provide proper shelter from the elements, and residents have had to find various items to keep the wind and rain out of their tents. Other tents have not been able to hold up against the powerful winter storms.

Most of the sites report having an adequate number of blankets. Though many of the blankets provided are considered to be acceptable for the present colder weather conditions, they are proving to be insufficient. This is especially true at sites where residents sleep in tents. Some people have reported respiratory irritation as a result of the fibres, which are shedding from some of the blankets.

Shelter Conditions Derived from Baseline Data (Table 1.5)

In only 46% of structures were families sheltered together. Data on shelter size was available for 32 sites; the square meterage ranged between 6 and 1200 square meters, the average shelter size was 192 square meters.

Data on availability of mattresses was available for a limited number of sites (N=44), among these 64% had adequate mattresses (100%). Data on availability of blankets was available for 51 sites, among these 76% had adequate blankets (100%).

Data on availability of electric light was available for all sites. 55% of sites had electric lighting in the sleeping areas, and 58% of sites had electric lighting in the communal areas.

Security remains very limited, where 61% of sites have no security presence at all, while 29% of sites had full-time 24-hour security. The remainder of the sites have less than 24-hour security presence.

Shelter Conditions Derived from Follow-up Baseline (Table 1.5a)

The details of shelter size and proportions with mattresses and bedding are also shown. Only two sites did not have electric lighting in the sleeping areas and three sites did not have electric lighting in the communal areas.

HEALTH

Many displaced people are able to access healthcare. However, there are some sites where people have been refused access to healthcare or transport to health facilities remains a challenge. Additionally, there are a few sites that have yet to be visited by a health care professional. Services at many camps remain unclear to many residents, as hours of operations can be inconsistent or unknown. This information below will hopefully help Sub District managers and others in the Department of Health organise health services.

Health Services from Baseline Data (Table 1.6)

Health services were reported on site for 61% of sites (48/79) at least once daily, and 13% (10/79) had health services on site less than daily. Also, 27% of sites (21/79) only had referral to health services. The proportion of sites reporting health services on site daily is incongruent with reports from the sites – we will reassess this in future and suggest these data be interpreted with caution.

For sites that had health services on site less than daily, the average distance to the closest referral site was 2,3km, for those sites that only had referral for health care; the average distance to the closet referral clinic was 9,6km. For sites that had daily health services the closest referral clinic was 2,0km away.

Health Services from Follow-up Baseline (Table 1.6a)

There was data available on 30 sites. Health care had been refused at 5 sites (the details, where available, are tabulated). Transport to the nearest health care facility was not available at 40% of sites, and transport back from these facilities was not available at 43% of sites. A first aid kit was not available at 60% of sites. There had been 6 cases of diarrhoea reported, fever at one site, 5 cases of rash, and 26 cases of persistent cough. A health care worker was on site at 10 of the sites only; details of hours and/or days each week are tabulated.

COMMUNICATION

All sites have requested and need access to more information. Reading material for adults was available at 20% of sites (16/79) and there was also regular information dissemination. In addition, 15% of sites (12/79) had had legal advice and assistance with repatriation or reintegration (Table 1.7).

Many residents are unaware of the actions of Government. They need more detailed and regular information regarding the policies that affect them, their rights, and any news about their future.

Newspapers are requested so that they can be informed of current events related to their situation and to the country as a whole. They would also like to use these resources to help them find employment.

There is currently a large gap in the information available in sites. This needs to be addressed.

SERVICES RELATED TO CHILDREN (BASELINE) (TABLE 1.7A)

There were children present at 35 sites or camps. At 22% of these (7/25) families were not housed together. At 63% of sites (20/32) there were no milk supplements for children and also no disposable nappies available (in future reports this will be broken down according to number of babies). At 55% of sites (18/33) children were not able to attend school (in future reports this will be refined to include only the number of school going children). At 56% of sites (19/24) there were no recreational facilities for children.

FOLLOW-UP DATA (TABLE 1.7B)

The data at follow-up are shown in Table 1.7a for 30 sites assessed to date. One third (33%) of sites had sanitary towels available for women. Other details such as the number of nappies per child, the number of sanitary towels per woman and other non-food items that may be required is shown.

At 8 sites children did attend school and at 8 sites children did not attend school; the remainder of sites did not have children. At 13 sites there were no recreational activities for children, at 8 sites there were. At only 6 sites was there an advice and legal centre established and at only 8 sites was there regular information dissemination. At 12 sites there was legal assistance with repatriation.

SITE MANAGEMENT AND DECISION MAKING – BASELINE (TABLE 1.8)

Only 18% of the sites had a responsible government official designated.

44% of sites had a responsible volunteer designated and 44% of sites had displaced people representatives designated. 37% of sites had initiated site meetings of all parties, while only 10% of all sites had minutes available for their last site meeting. Only 18% of sites had both men and women represented in the displaced people structure.

INDIVIDUAL SITE CONDITIONS FOR CAMPS

BLUE WATERS

The Blue Waters camp is situated on former holiday campsite with both brick and mortar housing available on a first come first serve basis, and tents. Presently this site houses over 400 residents, many of which had reintegrated but then returned to the camp.

Health

A government clinic is located just outside the camp and operates twice weekly (Tuesdays and Thursdays) with at least one nurse in attendance, according to the people living there. Presently is there a medical aid kit available. Monitors were told that a first aid kit has been ordered, but has yet to arrive.

Food

Food is served twice a day to residents. In the morning bread and juice is served. Peanut butter is occasionally available, as well as jam, but this is very sporadic. For dinner, residents have been receiving the same cooked meal of rice and beans or mince. Meat is so sparse that most residents do not get any with their serving. Recently, some of the meat delivered was off making several people ill, and resulting in one person having to be taken to hospital. Others refused to eat it. Also, another meal of cabbage carrots and rice delivered over the weekend of 4 July was also off.

Nutritional needs are not being met by the meals provided, and the daily diet lacks variety. No provisions for young children ages 2-7 are available, though requests for cereal have been made repeatedly.

The amount of baby formula is inadequate for the number of infants at this location. Less than two bottles of formula were available for each baby every three days according to a recent account by TAC assessors. The formula that has been used was seen to cause itching and irritation for many infants. The supplies baby formula and nappies for the last two weeks have been from the refugee centre. This supply must last two weeks, as they cannot send new supplies every week.

Shelter

The camp lacks security, as it has little lighting at night. Standards for displaced persons require that nighttime lighting of grounds is needed. Women and children have reported not feeling safe in the camp. Travelling to the toilets at night is particularly worrisome for many residents.

Though there are mattresses available to residents, many people have raised concerns that the mattresses are known to cause skin irritation. Residents also require more blankets, as the feel the present supply does not allow them to properly handle the winter cold.

Most of the original residents who arrived at the outbreak of the violence live in brick bungalows, but many of the residents, who have arrived in recent weeks, live in tents. This site needs more tents, and the tents currently available are unable to properly protect against the weather. Shelter for displaced persons must provide protection from the elements.

Sanitation

While toilets fall within norms and standards for ratio of number of toilets to people, some of the toilets are unusable, as they do not flush. Though this facility does have hot water, it is not enough for the 400+ residents; instead only about 10 people are able to access the hot water for bathing.

Communication

Blue Waters is an isolated camp. Many of the residents feel frustrated about not being able to work, or to travel into town to find new work. There is no transport available to assist people with getting out of the camp and thus people are unable to find jobs to afford reintegration.

Community members would like access to newspapers as they can look for employment and keep up with current issues that affect them. Most people are unaware of the situation at other camps and would like to be in communication with other camps.

HARMONY PARK

This beach location has over 400 residents living in tents. Unlike many other sites, they do not have many severe transport, electricity or food needs.

Health

There is no health clinic on site, but the police have been active in transporting residents to nearby medical facilities when necessary.

Food

Meals here are occasionally served three times a day, though this is inconsistent. Sundays, for example, will only have two meals served. Like many other locations the meals are not nutritionally adequate, nor do they vary. Some of the food delivered to the camp arrives spoiled, such as some sour milk that was given to residents recently.

The mothers of the camp are able to feed the children themselves. In addition, children are able to have approximately two servings of vegetables a week. Residents used to be able to dish their own food, but now there is concern that the same person who is cleaning the toilets is now serving food.

Shelter

There is electricity present throughout the camp, but overall security has been a concern. There is a lax entry system to the camp, and a security firm has been brought in to help resolve the issue. Unfortunately, some residents and former residents have reported cases of theft. In order to improve security, body searches were implemented as a result of these concerns. Security issues seem to be improving over time, however camp management has now begun using the ID documents from the Department of Home Affairs (DHA) registration as proof of residence. Not every resident has these documents yet and it is unclear how they will gain access to the camp.

The tents provided to residents of the camp are not protecting them from the winter weather, and many have noted that they are not able to remain dry at night.

The camp is not fully supplied with mattresses, but a majority of residents have one. There are blankets available to everyone, but the quality of the blankets handed out is questionable according to residents. Some residents referred to the blankets as dog blankets.

There were reports that volunteers arrived with clothing for residents, but were turned away at the gate and unable to leave their donations.

Sanitation

There are separate showers and toilets for men and women at this site, as well as fresh water.

Communication

The camp manager notes that this site has had little communication with anybody outside of the camp, including government. Much like the other camps, the greatest problem seems to be communication as to the future for the residents of the camp.

SILVERSTROOM

Presently, this site has just fewer than 100 residents. It is located at a holiday resort located approximately 55 kilometres from the city centre of Cape Town, and over 10 km from the nearest residential area (Atlantis). This camp is severely isolated, with residents cut-off from contact with the outside world. The isolation prevents people from getting to work, and from travelling to Home Affairs.

Health

This location does have a separate, onsite medical facility that offers care on Tuesdays and Thursdays from 10:00 to 14:00. In cases of medical emergencies, ambulances are sent to the camp, but no return trips are provided. The on-site managers have been organized enough to make alternate arrangements for ensuring the resident's return. There are concerns that trips to nearby clinics for general health needs, which cannot be met by the on-site clinic, are going to be limited to medical emergencies only.

Food

This location typically receives two meals a day from the Red Cross. There is very little variance to the meals served at this location. This site has been receiving milk formula from TAC, as requests by the site manager have gone unfulfilled by Government.

Shelter

Orders for mattresses and blankets for all residents were recently fulfilled.

The tents are unable to hold up to the winter weather conditions. The roofs leak, and the sides and doors are unsecured, which allows cold wind and water to enter easily. Tents must be better insulated and able to prevent leaks.

For security reasons, residents are required to have wristbands to enter the camp. Many residents now carry the bands with them, but do not wear them. If they do not have a wristband, they cannot return to the camp. This can cause a situation where people are unable to easily come and go from the camp. The United Nations standards for displaced people require that residents should not be forcibly restricted to "camps". People should have the ability to move freely in and out of the camp.

Some residents are fearful of some police officers and other security officers hired to patrol the camp. The residents are concerned about xenophobic tendencies. Because of those fears, security guards do not walk among or inside the tents.

Sanitation

Sanitation facilities are divided by sex and appear sufficient for camp residents. There are plenty of portable toilets (18), as well as flush toilets (12 per sex). Fortunately, this site also has hot water available as well as taps for drinking water.

Communication

The site reports a severe lack of communication and no dissemination of information. The displaced people and officials have requested access to information such as newspapers or relevant pamphlets and reports from organizations and agencies working with the camps.

The location of the camp makes many residents feel extremely isolated and abandoned. They have no access to information and have no understanding of what their future holds. They also do not know what steps they should be taking. They feel they have no grasp of the outside world, or of the situation of people in other camps. Although a television has been set up in one of the tents, there is currently no reception, which means there is no access to national news services. There is no radio at this camp.

SOETWATER

This location is the largest camp, with a population of 850 residents. It is also one of the more isolated camps with a seaside location that makes it very exposed to the elements. It is divided into two camps, Der Anker, which was recently closed due to the strong winter weather, and Medusa.

Health

Medical services at this camp are undertaken through biweekly visits of practitioners from nearby Fishoek hospital. A private practitioner from Masiphumele visits the site daily for one hour, but many residents are unaware that he is there. This is also true of the medical tent on site. It is often unclear to residents when services are available. Police often assist in transporting residents to receive medical care.

There are no nappies or sanitary towels available. The current supply is dwindling and deliveries are often late.

Food

This site receives only two meals a day. The morning meal consists only of juice and bread. Often, this meal is not delivered until three in the afternoon. The evening meal is rice and a bean based stew, which is often too spicy for young children, preventing many of them from being able to eat it. The evening meal is curry and rice that is too spicy for young children preventing many of them from being able to eat it. There is no variety to the meals served, nor are there fruits, vegetables, or milk products served. It appears that there has been no thought given to nutritional value or cultural suitability of the foods provided.

Often, there is not enough food for everyone, as the supply seems to be very erratic. There is no permanent supply of food for children and babies. The quantity and quality of food at this site is a grave concern, volunteers have been trying to find private donations of fruits and vegetable. There are about six tents with stoves where people are cooking their own food.

Shelter

Though there is a private security firm offering 24-hour service, many residents have commented that no security is present at night. There is limited 24-hour lighting onsite, and many women are afraid to leave their tents to use the toilets after dark.

The tents provided are unable to handle the harsher weather of a site located so close to the ocean. The tents are leaking, and residents are doing their best to reinforce holes and gaps with blankets, wood, and plastic. Location, plus the winter weather have caused excessive wind, rain, and cold which residents are ill equipped to handle. Many tents were destroyed by the weather, and the tents assembled as replacements are not in good shape. Some tents are now overcrowded with people. A portion of the newer tents, which were built to replace the tents that were destroyed at Den Anker, only have wooden pallets for flooring.

Generally there are enough mattresses for residents, but there are not nearly enough blankets. What blankets are available are making many people sick. They are of low quality and have caused many people to have skin irritation.

The security is suitable, but there have been some instances of violence by security guards. These seem to have been resolved quickly, with the removal of that guard from the site. In addition, some have reported that guards have denied people access to the sites.

Sanitation

Many of the taps onsite have been breaking. So while there is adequate drinking water showering facilities for men and women, many are unable to utilize these because there is often no water accessible. In addition this site is often without washing powder and toiletries for weeks at a time. As a result the hygiene of residents and facilities is compromised. There is also no hot water available. The three external taps where residents wash and brush their teeth has had water pooled underneath for over three weeks

Since Den Anker has been closed, access to the brick ablution blocks has also been eliminated. Only one block is open, but the water has been switched off. There are only ten working chemical toilets on the Den Anker side because 15 were knocked over by the storm on the 16th June and have not been restored.

Communication

This site also suffers from a severe lack of communication. In addition, there is no transport for this isolated location.

YOUNGSFIELD

The Youngsfield camp is situated on an active military base with over 600 residents.

Health

Medical personnel are now frequenting the camp. Typically there is a nurse on site to administer care. If transport to a hospital is necessary, the government has provided a car and there are drivers available. Some residents who have met with visiting medical personnel have expressed concern that they have received the wrong medication. There is transport available to outside clinics, but there is often no return transport available.

The visiting psychiatrists report that while there are many males that seek assistance, few females have come for help.

Food

The food rations are often cut back. While technically the residents are fed twice a day, the residents regard their morning serving of half a cup of tea and a jam sandwich as half a meal. Occasionally, they are rationed two jam sandwiches. Often times, many people are unable to even get a ration. For the evening meal, small amounts of curry and rice are served, though on one occasion, monitors observed a soup being served that appeared inedible. Many of these meals have made the residents sick. The food is being delivered by SANZAF, which often delivers food that has passed expiry and does not deliver food on time.

Shelter

Though this is a largely safe site, there is no outside lighting at night near the toilets. Lighting is now present in the tents.

The tents residents live in are unable to handle the wintry weather. The original canvas tents were replaced with plastic ones to keep out the rain, but they still flood and then condense at night. More cots are needed to get the mattresses off ground when the tents flood; most of the residents are sleeping on wet mattresses. To avoid this problem, many people have moved into other tents.

There are not enough blankets for all the residents, and the blankets that have been handed out are problematic. The blankets available are of very poor quality and are often dirty. The blankets shed and have caused many people to develop respiratory issues, and people with asthma are thus unable to use them.

This camp lies on a military base, for that reason is considered a secure facility. Unfortunately, this location does not provide the most ideal site for a camp. Assessors noted that one evening during the registration process, camp entry was being very strictly regulated. During this time a resident returned to the camp from work and did not have the proper ID to enter. He was unaware of the heightened entry requirements, and became frustrated. When he tried to enter the camp after being refused, a military guard pointed a gun at him. Base guards follow strict protocols when someone tries to gain access to a military location. They are authorized to use force when unauthorized people are perceived to be seeking entry onto the base, which includes the camp area.

Sanitation

The original portable toilets were replaced with even poorer quality portable toilets that often do not flush properly. As there are no lights at night, many people fear walking to the toilets because of the presence of mole snakes and the dark. As a result many people have dug their own toilets in empty tents or within a short distance of their tent. These pits of waste are often visible when walking through the site. To combat this toilets have been spread throughout the camp, and efforts are underway to clean. Unfortunately, the present toilets are still hard for children to utilize, as they are unable to reach the seats.

There are no separate toilets or showering facilities for men and women, nor is hot water available. The taps only work sometimes, so there is often no water available. There are five showers reported broken in one shower block. As a result, the total number of showers available for 650 people down is five.

A vital situation regarding sanitation is that urine sometimes passes through the showers. This is creating a very unhygienic situation. In addition, the toilets and showers are not being cleaned.

Parents are now able to obtain new nappies for their children. Two nappies are available during the day, and three are available for the night.

Communication

Residents of this camp feel uncertain future and have expressed a desire to be kept up to date with news regarding their situation. There are no modes of communication to available to aid with job searches.
