

Updated Western Cape Displaced People Report 24 July

Summary of data collected by TAC ALP & Civil society

This report details the follow-up data collected subsequent to the report based on data up to and including 14 July. The bulk of this report utilised data collected in the period between the release of the previous report and 24 July. This updated report serves to highlight any changes in the living circumstances of the displaced people in the last week.



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EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

1. Five camps and 12 sites were assessed in the past 10 days since the last report
2. The total number of IDPs remained roughly constant (N=5077) and there were no significant changes in the demographic of the population aside from the number of adults increasing slightly and the number of children decreasing slightly
3. There were 37 new arrivals at the sites that were reassessed
4. There were 21 new departures from the sites that were reassessed
5. Food provision for both adults and children had diminished at some sites particularly those reliant on voluntary donations
6. There was insufficient supply of milk supplements for infants at 4 community sites and 2 camps
7. The assessed sites for this report met the norms for number of toilets and washing facilities (except at 2 camps: Youngsfield where every 26 persons shared a toilet and every 108 persons had to share a shower and Blue Waters where every 70 persons shared a toilet and every 141 persons shared washing facilities)
8. Shelter conditions, especially lighting in female toilets and female bathing areas at some sites require attention, particularly at Youngsfield. Lighting has improved in Blue Waters
9. There has been no improvement in the tents at Youngsfield and Soetwater which continue to provide inadequate shelter.
10. Health access (transport to and from the nearest health facility) needs to be improved. Health workers are required to visit Harmony Park on a regular basis. First aid kits are required at Silverstroom, and Blue Waters camps.
11. Basic non-food items continue to be overlooked. In particular, there are an insufficient, sometimes no supply of nappies at Youngsfield and Soetwater and insufficient supply of sanitary towels at Harmony Park and Soetwater
12. Children at Soetwater, Blue Waters and Silverstroom are currently not accessing education.

RECOMMENDATIONS

Based on the issues identified above, TAC and ALP recommends that Government:

1. Meet the recommendations made in the last report produced on 18 of July 2008 (and updated 21 July 2008). For the camps and sites assessed in this follow-up report the following additional recommendations need to be urgently addressed.
 - a. A health care professional should regularly run a clinic at Harmony since transport is no longer available to a health care facility.
 - b. First aid kits need to be arranged for Silverstroom and Blue Waters camps.
 - c. The numbers of toilets and showers at Youngsfield and Blue Waters are increased to meet international norms and standards.
 - d. Lighting at the toilets and showers in Youngsfield is improved.
 - e. While the need to ensure a supply basic non food items, including nappies and sanitary towels was recommended in the previous report, in some sites the supply has deteriorated therefore this report particularly emphasis this issue.
 - f. This report does not cover safety and security in detail and therefore recommends Government review this issue.

INTRODUCTION

Re-assessments have been done for all camps and the following 12 sites: House in Parrow, KTC Community Centre, Longstreet Artists, Lower Crossroads Community Hall, Zolani Centre, Belhar Mosque, Khayelitsha Site B Community Hall, Masibambane, Parow Methodist Church, Pinelands Methodist Church, Universal Evangelical Church, and Saartjie Baartman Centre for Women & Children.

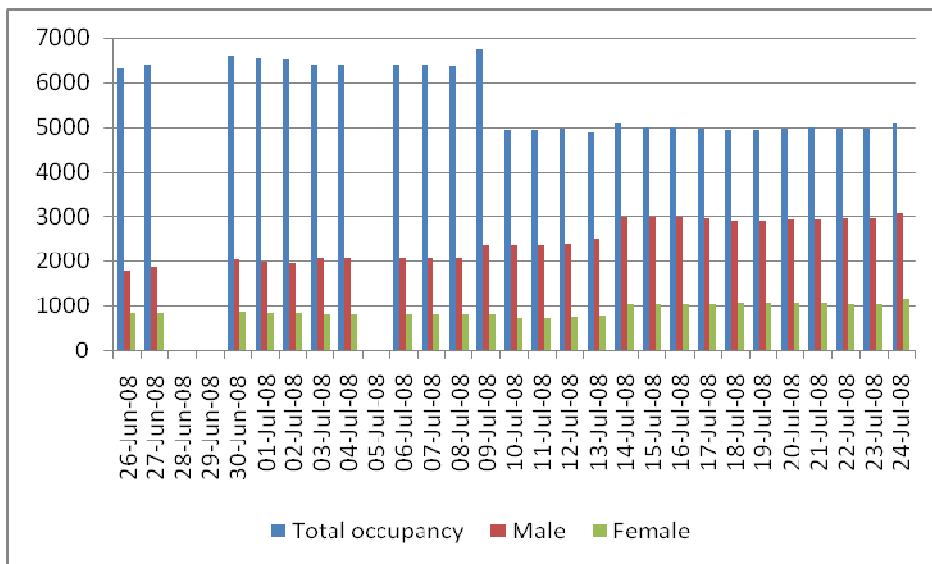


Figure 1 Changes in total population and population by sex housed at the 95 sites currently evaluated over time

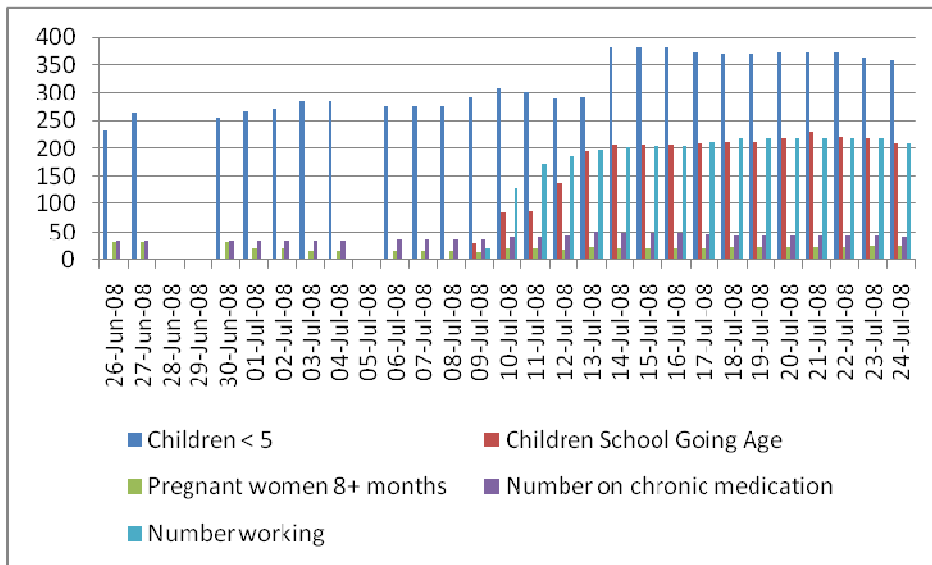


Figure 2 Population of exceptionally vulnerable persons housed in the 95 currently evaluated sites over time

There were 95 active sites on the 24th of July, 93 of which had been assessed at least once (the previous report stated that there were only 53 sites active in figures 1 and 2 – instead the 53 sites should have been reported as a sub-set of the over 90 sites that have been assessed for trends over time).

A number of new variables were analysed and tabulated for this update (number of babies, number of people working, whether shelter was deemed adequate by displaced people, availability of lighting in female toilets and bathing areas, and security in the camps and sites).

The table numbering used in the report issued on the 14th has been maintained to enable easier comparison and the data of the 24th and 14th are now presented side by side.

These data are again shown in tabulated form according to site in the appendix: this is further divided according to date of assessment.

All the sites included in this report had been previously assessed but a new “follow-up form” was only introduced recently, therefore for Tables 1.3a onwards the data for the 14th of July is not available for comparison for all sites.

LIMITATIONS AND THEIR IMPLICATIONS

Only a sample of all the sites was reassessed, thus interpretation of these data should not be extrapolated to other sites.

The occupancy data are a combination of old and new data (Table 1.1a). All the other data presented is newly collected data. A comparison of the occupancy only for the sites that were re-assessed is shown in Table 1.1b.

OCCUPANCY

On the 24th of July the occupancy of the active sites was as follows (shown in Table 1.1a), the occupancy restricted to those sites that were reassessed since the 14th of July is shown in Table 1.1b:

The number of babies aged less than 1 year was newly assessed: there were 89 babies in total on the 24th of July (among the reassessed sites there were 80 babies – data not tabulated).

Since the last report there has been little change in the total population of displaced people (a slight decrease in numbers), nor in the proportion of male and female displaced people.

For the sites that were reassessed (this is a better comparison since only a subset were reassessed in past 10 days) the numbers have increased slightly (total, males, females, number working, number of pregnant women and number of babies – the numbers of children and people on chronic medication has decreased).

The same limitations regarding the reliability of numbers other than the total number of displaced people noted in the previous report are still relevant.

For this reason occupancy trends over time for the total number of persons is the most reliable estimate and is shown in Figure 1.

The number of especially vulnerable persons is shown in Figure 2, the number of babies and the number of displaced people working has been added to this figure. The number of people working varies from day to day at the sites since most work is part-time work. The appearance that the number of people working has increased recently is a reflection of this data only being collected in the most recent assessments. The numerical trends for the other data have not changed significantly since the last report.

Number of Departures and Arrivals at Most Recent Follow-up (Tables 1.2, 1.2a and 1.2b)

Since the previous report there have been 37 new arrivals and 21 new departures from the reassessed sites.

Table 1.2a shows that 8/21 departures left for their original community, two went to another community, zero went to another displaced person site, zero were repatriated and the details for nine were unknown.

The new arrivals, tabulated in Table 1.2b, show that 11/37 came from another displaced person site, 12 came from their original community, and seven from another community and information was either not collected or unknown for the remaining seven arrivals.

In certain instances the data available from the sites was inadequate, thus the number of arrivals and departures was calculated by comparing the numbers at the previous assessment with those from this assessment. This obviously only provides a rough estimate since information on arrivals and departures is “collapsed” during calculation.

At Blue Waters there were now 111 more people than at the previous assessment. Similarly at Harmony Park Camp there were 34 additional people. At Masimbambane there are now 47 fewer people. For sites where the change in population was less than 30, please see table.

FOOD

Food Provision Distribution Information Derived From Follow-up (Table 1.3a)

At Belhar Mosque food had previously been deemed sufficient and a regular food provider had been designated. This was no longer the case at the most recent assessment.

The food provision was unchanged at Khayelitsha Site B and at Masimbambane.

At Pinelands Methodist Church a regular food provider had recently been designated (using TAC donations).

Both Soetwater and Youngsfield camps food continued to be deemed insufficient by the displaced people residing there.

At the seven newly assessed sites, food was mostly deemed insufficient by the residents and no regular food provider had been designated for most of them. At four of these sites food supplements for children were not available.

Milk supplements for children were insufficient at Harmony and Soetwater. At Harmony milk supplements had been provided through voluntary donations but these have now stopped.

SANITATION

Sanitation Information Derived from Follow-up (Table 1.4a)

At Harmony Camp there were separate toilets, and separate washing facilities for men and women at the previous assessment; at the most recent assessment, this had been discontinued.

Conditions at Masimbambane had improved since the last assessment, largely because more than half the IDPs had departed.

At Pinelands Methodist Church conditions and supplies for cleaning had deteriorated for all variables measured.

At the 8 newly assessed sites sanitation conditions were mostly inadequate.

Ratios of people to toilets, washing facilities and basins were within norms (for the sites with available data) except for the 2 camps: Youngsfield where there were now 26 people per toilet and 108 people per shower (washing facility). The ratios for toilets have changed at Youngsfield because 9 toilets were removed from Youngsfield this week and the population has remained roughly the same. At Blue Waters the ratio of people to toilets has worsened to 70 people per toilet and 141 people sharing washing facilities.

SHELTER

Since the previous report, no substantial changes to shelter conditions have been made.

Shelter Conditions Derived from Follow-up (Table 1.5a)

The displaced people residing at most of the sites deemed their shelter inadequate. There was room for improvement in the proportions and quality of mattresses and blankets for sleeping. Lighting in communal and sleeping areas had deteriorated at sites that had been previously assessed and lighting in most of the newly assessed sites was inadequate. Security was also mostly poor.

HEALTH

Health Services from Follow-up (Table 1.6a)

Health care had been refused at two sites (the details, where available, are tabulated). Transport to the nearest health care facility was not available at seven of the sites, and transport back from these facilities was not available at eight of the sites. A first aid kit was not available at (at least) seven of the sites.

Among the reassessed sites: at Harmony Camp, transport to the nearest health facility that had previously been available was discontinued.

At Khayelitsha Site B, health care had been refused to IDPs (this is likely to be a repeat of the previously reported case).

At Masimbambane, there was now no first aid kit available (that had previously been available) but health care not been refused since the previous assessment (as had previously been refused, thus indicating an improvement in this respect).

At Pinelands Methodist Church, transport to the nearest health facility that had previously been available was discontinued.

At newly assessed camps and sites, health care had been refused at "Home in Parrow" – the clinic that had refused health care was the Parrow clinic on 01/07/2008.

At KTC Community Hall, Longstreet Artists, Lower Crossroads Community Hall, and Zolani Centre there was neither transport to nor from the nearest health facility, nor a first aid kit.

At Silverstroom, Soetwater and Blue Waters camps there was no first aid kit available.

NON FOOD ITEMS, EDUCATION AND SERVICES

Disposable Nappies, Sanitary Towels, Education and Other Services from Follow-up (Table 1.7)

Harmony Camp had previously had sanitary towels available to women; this was not the case at the recent assessment. Previously, Youngsfield camp had had sufficient provision of sanitary towels, this is now insufficient. At Soetwater the supply of sanitary towels and nappies has reduced. At Belhar Mosque there were also no sanitary towels available however this is understandable as all the women there have now left.

At Pinelands Methodist Church previously had received legal advice, the regular dissemination of information and the legal assistance with repatriation was no longer provided.

At the newly assessed sites the disposable nappies were available at the 3 sites with children but only 3/8 sites had sanitary towels available for women. At none of the three sites with children, were children able to attend school and at one of the sites there were no recreation facilities for children.

Advice and legal centres, information dissemination and legal assistance with repatriation were mostly unavailable at newly assessed sites.

INDIVIDUAL SITE CONDITIONS FOR CAMPS

BLUE WATERS

Health

Though there is a clinic nearby, there is presently no medical kit available on site.

The assessors have expressed concerns that the on-site committee is reluctant to encourage those who need to go to hospital to seek treatment. Largely, this is because of poor treatment at these centres in the past. This has improved, and residents should be urged to seek treatment, but the IDP leadership is unwilling to take on the responsibility for checking up on them.

Food

Food has slightly improved now that Mustadafin is preparing the food, though they have been providing the food for some time. The volunteers have mentioned that the food has come late for two days, and that this upsets the residents, as they are forced to wait and grow hungry. It also gets dark very quickly, making it more difficult to distribute food. Unfortunately, the food has not varied at all despite these changes. Food is served twice a day to residents. In the morning bread and juice is served. There is no longer any jam or peanut butter being served. Any donations of this kind were made a long time ago, and have since run out.

Young children have received additional feeds like Pronutro from Friday (18 July) onwards and Nido milk supplements. There is now a more steady and frequent supply of baby feeds, but the Refugee Centre and TAC, and not the government, sent these additional supplies.

Shelter

Lighting around the camp has improved. Residents are able to report problems to site management and this is seen to in an efficient way. Any recent issues with power on site were due to heightened electricity demand.

No change has been made to provide additional or higher quality blankets and mattresses.

There is an additional concern for parents with babies under one month-old. Many would like to utilise alternate accommodation as their children are so young and the tents become very cold when the wind sets in.

Sanitation

Toilets are only being emptied once every five days, which is causing problems. In additions, residents note that toilets are not being cleaned regularly enough and that the last delivery of toilet paper was three weeks ago.

Communication

Blue Waters is an isolated camp. There is no transport available to assist people with getting out of the camp and thus people are unable to find jobs to afford reintegration. This is also a problem for some children who are walking over an overgrown field to get to the main road to access taxi's but this is dangerous, especially in the afternoon's.

Camp residents have not received any information from government except for a notice from Home Affairs regarding registration. There is a genuine lack of knowledge about this process, especially about any benefits it may provide.

HARMONY PARK

Health

There is no health clinic on site, and it was previously reported that police helped transport people to nearby clinics. This is now not the case.

Food

The food needs to vary; people are increasingly concerned about the quality and quantity.

The milk supplements and other supplies were provided by outside sources (NGO's or church groups) but donations have been discontinued for various reasons.

Shelter

The tents are still leaking badly, and the carpets on the floor remain wet. People are refusing to accept the blankets provided because they give them, and their children, respiratory problems. As reported for other sites, the lint from the blankets shed easily. In addition, these blankets do not provide much warmth.

The camp is not fully supplied with mattresses; the camp is still 328 mattresses short of supplying the whole camp. The most recent supply of mattresses was distributed by the residents to the women in the camp.

Sanitation

Though sanitation conditions remain adequate, one of the geysers broke and the manager of the park is working to repair it. As a result, there is no hot water available.

Communication

The camp manager notes that this site has had little communication with anybody outside of the camp, including government. Much like the other camps, the greatest problem seems to be communication as to the future for the residents of the camp.

SOETWATER

Health

There is a volunteer medical practitioner in the camp every day, for at least an hour to see serious cases. Nurses are on duty every day for as long as patients need them to be there.

There are still no nappies or sanitary towels available. The current supply is dwindling and deliveries are often late.

Food

The camp was very excited about a pilot program to have two kitchens on site for residents to prepare their own food. Due to “financial blockages” this program has been stalled, and the necessary infrastructure is not available.

Shelter

Some private donations are able to get through to the camp and are welcome, but not to the extent that is publicised. When donations are received on-site, they are difficult to distribute, especially if there is not enough for everyone.

Sanitation

No changes in sanitation issues have been reported.

Communication

There are now newspapers accessible for many of the residents.

YOUNGSFIELD

Health

The main health concern is with dwindling nappy supplies. Mothers are obtaining fewer and fewer nappies, and the weather appears to have led to an increase in diarrhea causing an increased need for nappies. (On Friday 25 July there were no nappies available and an emergency supply was sent by TAC).

Food

The food rations have remained the same since the last report. However, there are now apples and oranges available 1-2 times a week.

Children used to receive an extra meal mid-day, but this has recently stopped. As a result, the children's food situation has worsened. This is due to the departure of a volunteer who ran the children's tent. There appears to be some miscommunication regarding this change. The camp manager claims that food is being cooked for the children, though the children say they are not getting it. The site assessors are not sure if this is merely a case of the children not being aware that there is lunch for them or if management is providing false information.

Shelter

New blankets were handed out by the Refugee Center since the last report was issued. These blankets are much improved from the last ones. Tents still remain inadequate and have not been reinforced to handle the winter weather.

Sanitation

The total number of toilets has decreased recently. Fifteen toilets were removed by order of the city council. This leaves the number of toilets, at 25, and one of them is locked and reserved for camp managers and police, leaving 24 toilets for 650-700 people. The remaining toilets are in the darkest area of the camp and were the least used of all the toilets. Camp management was not included in this decision, and was not able to assist in choosing which would be removed.

The tap structure was also taken down, leaving the camp with six taps with very poor water pressure.

There are six showers in the camp, which are all currently working.

Communication

There are still no modes of communication to available to aid with job searches.

Internal political relations between refugee groups and tensions between management and refugees grow by the day.
